She is a member of the Rabbinical Assembly and Neshama: Association for Jewish Chaplains, which recognized her as a Board Certified Chaplain in 2014.

Rabbi Miller's commitment to "meeting people where they are" and building inclusive communities has been central to her work as a hospice chaplain and serving Jewish adults with developmental disabilities. She is passionate about the creative arts and recognizing the richness of the diverse traditions found throughout the international Jewish community. As a teacher, Rabbi Miller loves to learn, share and "kvell" with her students.
