At Simchat Torah services on Tuesday, October 25, we honor the following distinguished congregants:



Chatan Torah: Sol Messenger came to Buffalo as a child in 1942 after multiple escapes from the Nazis, including a journey on the SS St. Louis. After about 4 to 6 weeks in public school, he gained English fluency and became an honor student. Sol attended the University of Buffalo for his bachelor's and medical degrees. He had an internship at what is now ECMC, and residencies in pathology at the current ECMC and Deaconess hospitals before a stint in the army as the head pathologist of his unit. Upon completion of his military service, Sol returned to Buffalo and worked as a pathologist at the Millard Fillmore Hospitals from 1963 until his retirement in 2007.

Sol has been active as a member of the speaker's bureau of the Holocaust Resource Center and as a patron of the Kadimah Academy. At Temple, he davens, reads Torah, chants haftarah, and has been a member of the Board of Trustees.

Kallah B'reishit: Ruth Merlin was born in Tel Aviv and joined the Maccabee youth organization. During the War of Independence, she was a truck driver for Israel's army. She met Irving in Israel; they married in 1951, in Lexington, KY, where their four daughters were born. They came to Buffalo in the early 1960s.

Ruth has taught Hebrew and music for Temple Beth El, Temple Shaarey Zedek, Temple Beth Tzedek, the Kadimah Academy, the Board of Jewish Education, and Temple Sinai. She says she especially enjoyed teaching at Kadimah because she met her students early in the day, before they became tired. She has been one of the primary musicians for Keshet and many other programs and events at Temple.

SIMCHAT TORAH KIDDUSH

The annual Simḥat Torah Kiddush lunch will be held at noon on Tuesday, October 25. The assassination of Tsar Alexander II on March 13, 1881, introduced chaos into the Russian polity and unleashed anti-democratic forces of repression, oppression and suppression of civil liberties. In particular, anti-Semitism in Russia, beginning with the May Laws in 1882 that severely restricted Jewish rights and liberties, was given government sanction. A series of pogroms erupted under the eyes of Russian authorities, in which hundreds of Jews were murdered by marauding mobs. For some Jewish Russians, remaining in Russia was no longer an option.



Most of the Russian Jews who left in the early 1880s immigrated to America. But in some cities in the Pale of Settlement, nascent Zionist groups formed to send immigrants to Palestine. The most important and most successful group was called the HoveveiTzion, the lovers of Zion. A few hundred people made the journey from Russia to Palestine.

Among the first agricultural settlements established during that period was Zikhron Yaakov, south of Haifa. Perched on the southern edge of the Carmel mountain range, Zikhron Yaakov overlooks the Mediterranean on the west and verdant fields on the east. The members of HoveveiTzion were long on passion and devotion to building the land and painfully short on knowledge of agriculture. The early settlements, Zikhron included, were failing, and the members of Hovevei were starving and dying of malaria.

A leader of Hovevei in Russia, Rabbi Samuel Mohliver, enlisted the support of Baron Edmund de Rothschild. If not for Rothschild, the early settlements would have perished. Zikhron Yaakov was named for the Baron's father, James Mayer Rothschild. Not only did the Baron give financial support to the new settlement, he also replanted cuttings from his vineyards in Bordeaux in Zikhron to begin the Israeli wine industry. Today there are four vineyards surrounding Zikhron - Carmel, Tishbi, Binyamina and Recanati Wineries - all of which produce medal-winning wines.

Zikhron was an important center of the Jewish Brigade during World War I that fought on the side of the British against the Ottoman Turks who, of course, were in power in Palestine. The Jewish Brigade formed the basis for the Israel Defense Forces. The contribution that the Jewish Brigade made to the British conquest was a major factor in the issuance of the Balfour Declaration establishing a Jewish home in Palestine.

I fell in love with Zikhron Yaakov on my first trip to Israel. I spent the summer not far from Zikhron in a boarding school called Alonei Yitzhak. The beauty of the surrounding area and the charm of the city has always pulled me back, again and again. That is why I selected Zikhron as the place for us to spend my sabbatical. Today there are roughly 20,000 residents in Zikhron, which makes it large enough to have all the resources of a large city without the sound and sight pollution of a crowded metropolis. There are all kinds of Jews in Zikhron, from the ultra-Orthodox to the ultra-secular, and they manage to co-exist and cooperate. The city sponsors major festivals throughout the year and holiday celebrations. The schools are among the best in Israel and the resources for children are plentiful.

As I sit to write my October/November column it's almost Sukkot and unique to this year, Thanksgiving cannot be too far away. Having just spent the better part of a month in shul, many things come to mind, but most importantly, is my desire to be a better person this New Year both secularly and Jewishly. While sitting in shul for the *Yom Tovim*, I had the chance to think and plan just how to accomplish this. One of the tools available to me was the gift of memory.



I remember reading a handout several years ago that offered lots of inspirational and contemplative pieces for personal use in and out of the synagogue. One of the selections resonated with me, most probably because of what I now do for a living.

Dr. Ron Wolfson, *Fingerhut Professor of Education, American Jewish University*, and founder of "Synagogue 3000", spends a great amount of his time teaching and writing about moving synagogues from 'transactional' organizations into 'relational' ones. The latter (the stronger and healthier) is when people connect with each other to form lasting friendships that go beyond the bounds of building, pew or parking space.

So it was with great interest that I read an excerpt from his *Spirituality of Welcoming, "Jewish Values to Guide Communications"*. Wolfson lists seven Jewish values that we should incorporate into our synagogue lexicon and behavior, and some hints to help us model them:

Sh'tikah & Sh'miat Ha-Ozen: Silence & Active Listening

Reflect in silence while others are speaking
Refrain from interrupting while others are speaking

Dibbur: Speech

Speak the truth as you see it, but.....
Don't hurt others by speaking harshly to or about them
Speak as if God was listening to everything you say

Manage Your Stress

Find out how to take charge of taking care of yourself. On Sunday, November 20 at 10:00 AM at Temple Beth Tzedek on 621 Getzville Road, Dr. Eileen Trigoboff, Clinical Nurse Specialist, Psychiatry, and Dr. Daniel Trigoboff, licensed clinical psychologist, will explain how to manage stress.

Stress is different for every person - what is stressful for one person may or may not be stressful for another. Each person responds to stress in an entirely different way. It is to the human condition what tension is to a violin string:



- Too little and the music is dull, uninteresting
- Too much and the music is shrill or the string snaps

Manage stress so that you can be productive and happy. Stress and problems not handled in a timely and effective way can put you at risk for depression, anxiety disorders, or one or more physical illnesses.

Daniel H. Trigoboff, PhD., is a licensed clinical psychologist with a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from SUNY at Buffalo in 1974, Master's Degree in Clinical Psychology from the University of Iowa in 1978, and Doctorate in Clinical Psychology from the University of Iowa in 1980. Dr. Daniel Trigoboff has expertise in biofeedback, geriatric assessments, pain management, treatment of severe obsessive compulsive disorder, psychological assessments, and competency evaluations. He has presented nationally and internationally on a variety of professional topics, most recently in China at the Hebei Institute on psychological assessment of lethality and suicide prevention.

Eileen Trigoboff, RN, PMHCNS-BC, DNS, DABFN, is a Clinical Nurse Specialist in a private psychotherapy practice in Western New York.

Dr. Eileen Trigoboff is the Director of Program Evaluation at the Buffalo Psychiatric Center in Buffalo, New York and is the Liaison for the Office of Mental Health's Institutional Review Board. She is a national and international speaker and consultant on a wide variety of clinical, research, and professional topics including professional issues, mental health, research methodologies, statistics, pharmacology, assessment, psychopathologies, and interventions to health care, government, and corporate organizations.

Dr. Trigoboff earned her Doctorate in Nursing Science (DNS) in psychiatric nursing from the State University of New York at Buffalo. She is Board certified in 4 areas: as a Clinical Nurse Specialist in Adult Psychiatry/Mental Health, Diplomate and Fellow in the American College of Forensic Examiners on the American Board of Forensic Nursing, and in hospital and behavioral health program accreditation.

She is the author of 8 textbooks and coauthor/contributor to 14 books and dozens of journal articles. She also serves on the editorial boards of several professional journals and is on the editorial panel for a magazine on anxiety and depression. Dr. Trigoboff is an Expert Witness and provides expert testimony and reports across the country. She is active in community service venues, including clinical settings and family psychoeducation and support groups. She also serves as a computer systems and statistical consultant, and belongs to numerous professional nursing organizations.
