Project Beit Tefilah: Progress Continues

During the month of February, we interviewed construction managers and recommended hiring a firm to serve as our construction manager on an at risk basis. The cost of the construction manager comes out of the savings of not using a general contractor – their fees come out of what would have been the general contractor's profit, while preserving for the synagogue any other savings that can be achieved. The contract with the construction manager is being finalized. Our architect has also identified the engineering consultants that will participate in designing the building. Finally, the architect had productive preliminary meetings with various Town of Amherst departments. Our goal at this point is to have plans ready to submit to the Amherst Planning Board by April.

We also had a productive town hall meeting to provide more detailed information about the proposed building design, answered questions and provided members with the opportunity to provide input into the process. In addition to the many people who attended in person, dozens more participated by telephone. But even if you were not able to attend the meeting, don't hesitate to reach out to any member of the Project Beit Tefilah team.

Rabbi Perry Netter, spiritual leader of the Temple, blessed the new venture and said he’d take “a Tall or Grande De-Caf with 2 Sugar in the Raw packets to go” every morning. When reached for comment, Mr. Schultz stated, “This brings me back to my Jewish roots. In Judaism, worship, food and drink go together like bacon and eggs!”

Search Update #3

March 1, 2017

Dear Fellow Congregants,

Since I last wrote, we finalized the questionnaire, submitted it to the Rabbinical Assembly Placement Office on February 2, and had it approved that day, so the questionnaire was available for all qualified candidates to review. Since then, we have received resumes from interested candidates, which the committee is in the process of reviewing. We are still not in what I am told is the heaviest recruiting period (between Purim and Pesach), so I expect we will be seeing a number of additional resumes.

Those candidates who seem worthy of further consideration will be scheduled for a telephone interview with the Search Committee. The committee has been preparing for those interviews. We have formulated and adopted a set of questions for the telephone interview, addressing many of the issues you identified in the survey and interviews. Finally, we had a practice run-through of an interview in order to smooth out our procedures. Thanks to Larry Boxer for serving as our mock candidate.

If an applicant remains a viable candidate after the telephone interview, we will try to schedule a visit for a face-to-face interview with the committee and an introduction to Buffalo

generally, to Jewish Buffalo in particular, and to our facilities. The process is likely to take a while, so it is premature to conclude that the prospects of engaging a rabbi for the long term are low, and we should decide what alternative to pursue in the short term. That can come later. To give you a reference point, Rabbi Netter did not visit the congregation until mid-June. So please be patient, and we will share with you what information we can along the way.

I am writing to express my deep appreciation for our sacred community and to ask for your help for myself and other mourners and fellow congregants who need to say *Kaddish* for a loved one.

If you would be able to attend our morning (7:30 am) or afternoon/evening daily minyan (6 pm) you would be helping us to fulfill the crucial mitzvah of saying *Kaddish* and you will be fulfilling a mitzvah as well. Significantly your presence will provide immeasurable strength and comfort to mourners and others facing life challenges. Jewish law in requiring a minyan to say *Kaddish* helps to ensure that the mourner is not alone in prayer.

We often barely make or fail to make a minyan for our morning and afternoon services. It's dispiriting to attend without a minyan. There is a feeling of loss and regret when one has the obligation to say *Kaddish* and is unable to do so because ten Jewish adults are not in attendance. On the other hand it is gratifying and uplifting to be part of a minyan. And when our minyan room is filled with 15 or more it is joyful.

Please join us. Every member is vitally important to ensuring a vibrant and flourishing community. There may be no more poignant example of the importance of every individual than ten individuals forming a minyan allowing mourners and those observing a *Yartzeit* to say *Kaddish*.
